Dear Representative Neguse,

On behalf of Animal Wellness Action (AWA), a national policy and political organization seeking to enhance and advance legal protections for animals, we are pleased to endorse your reelection campaign for U.S. Congress.

You are one of the go-to leaders on animal welfare in the Congress. In the 118th Congress, you co-sponsored the FIGHT Act; the FDA Modernization Act 3.0; the Kangaroo Protection Act; the SAFE Act and the ACE Act, which you have led in the past. You also have been fighting for more funding for animal fighting enforcement and to create an animal cruelty crimes section at the Department of Justice.

Earlier this year you voted against two irresponsible bills the House Republican Leadership brought up on the House floor. First, you opposed legislation that weakened the Endangered Species Act by prematurely delisting gray wolves in the lower 48 states. In addition, you also opposed legislation that would have limited the ability of state and local governments to prohibit the use of lead ammunition on public lands and waterways. Both of these ill-advised bills barely passed the House of Representatives. Hopefully, they will die in the U.S. Senate. Your commitment to protecting animals by opposing these two measures is much appreciated.

In addition, you co-signed a letter opposing the EATS Act, arguably the most dangerous and illadvised farm policy proposal to come before the Congress in U.S. history. The EATS Act would wipe out important farm animal welfare laws in states, including Prop 12 in California and Question 3 in Massachusetts, which were overwhelmingly adopted by voters. EATS is an attack on states' rights, animal welfare, and home-grown family farmers. It is a give-away to Smithfield Foods, which is wholly controlled by China, and desperately wants to embrace the most extreme factory farming methods on U.S. soil.

Respect for American democracy and the proper treatment of animals are fundamental values that must be preserved and protected. The way we treat animals, as individuals and as a nation, is a measure of our core values and decency as a society. At AWA, we fully understand that cruel and callous treatment of animals is typically entangled with other antisocial behaviors that make our neighborhoods and communities less safe for families.

We are grateful for your leadership and strong expressions of support on a wide range of proanimal welfare policies.
